

IP 28 is an attack against Cattle Ranchers

Oregon is home to 11,000 ranchers raising 1.2 million cows annually as production animals to be harvested to provide high quality protein to the public.

These producers strive to feed their community while maintaining good health and wellbeing for the cattle.



Packing Plants

Unable to harvest cattle, packing plants and butcher shops would close, eliminating USDA approved places to safely harvest and process meat.



Artificial Insemination (AI)

A standard breeding practice that improves the health and safety of both the cows and handlers would be labeled sexual assault to the animal



No Pest Control

Ranchers strive to maintain clean food sources for production animals and treat against insects, rodents, and predation. IP 28 wants to stop this.



No Animal Leashes or Restraints

Horse training would be criminalized, due to the potential for an animal to injure itself while tethered or otherwise restrained, removing historic tools.



No More Hamburgers

Oregon has been ranked the highest in consumption of hamburgers per person in the US. IP 28 removes an integral and affordable protein source, potentially driving specific fast food chains out of the state.
